

## #2: Value Scales

---

### Supplies:

Bristol paper, paint brush, water dish, India ink, pencil, ruler, graphite stick or pencil, scissors or X-Acto knife, glue, artist's tape, Micron pens.

### Process:

On a piece of Bristol paper, layout three (3) grids measuring 1"X8".

Generate three (3) value scales:

A. Graphite: Create a value scale that demonstrates a gradient of 8 values, working from light to dark. Attempt to make all steps in your scale equal.

B. Ink Wash: Using ink and water, create a value scale that demonstrates a gradient of 8 values, working from white to black. Add ink to water, slowly working darker as you go. Remember darkening is easy, lightening is difficult.

C. Ink Pen: Use a Micron pen to create an 8-point value scale. Explore the following techniques: stippling, hatching, cross-hatching, scribbling. select one of these techniques for your value scale.

**\*NOTE: the 8 step scales do not include white.**

### Output:

Three (3) value scales measuring 1"X8" each, on one sheet of 9"X12" Bristol.
